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Dear Mr Greneron,

Thank you for the letter addressed to Commissioner Malmström in which you inform the Commission about the final resolution of the Executive Committee of the European Council of Police Trade Unions concerning *Claims of Police Unions: Vectors of the fight against corruption*.

The Commission places the fight against corruption high on its agenda and is committed to take firm actions to promote a reinforced anti-corruption policy across the EU. To this end, the Commission has adopted on 6 June this year an anti-corruption package through which an EU reporting mechanism for periodic assessment of Member States' efforts against corruption ('EU Anti-Corruption Report') was set up. The new Commission Communication on Fighting Corruption in the EU, part of the anti-corruption package, has also pointed to a number of EU policy areas where stronger focus on corruption is needed. The Communication stressed that judicial and police cooperation between EU Member States, as well as training of law enforcement personnel are matters of high relevance in the fight against corruption.
